 - Prepares us for the **ministry** of Jesus
 - Magi in Jerusalem/Bethlehem: **2.1-12**
 - To Egypt 2.13-15
 Death in Bethlehem 2.16-18
 To Nazareth: 2.19-23
 - John's ministry: 3.1-13 Jesus' baptism 3.14-17
 - Jesus' temptation: 4.1-11
 - The ministry in Galilee: 4.12-18.35
 - Prophecy: "Galilee of the Gentiles" Mt 4.15







- "Galilee of the Gentiles"
 Mt 4.15
 - Cited from **Is 9.1-2**
 - Anticipating a David-like king
 Is 9.6-7
 - Anticipating the gospel's spread to the non-Jewish world
 - Starting among the Galilean Gentiles Spreading to the rest of the world
 - Most of Matthew takes place away from Jerusalem
 - Galilee TransJordan Tyre/Sidon (seacoast) etc.







- Matthew starts with and focuses on Jesus' Galilean ministry:
 - Densely populated region
 - Served by two major highways
 - A "mixed" population

 - Galilee, unlike Judea, was "open" to the rest of the world
 - Jesus' ministry starts here and spreads to other areas

Evangelism In Matthew #6

Surrounded on three sides by other nations (W-Phoenicia, N/E-Syria, S-Samaria)









- The emphasis on Galilee and Gentiles in Matthew tells us that ...
 - Jesus was not just a Jewish Messiah
 - A Davidic king, yes. But a king for all nations
 - Galilee, appropriately, was already an "all nation" area
 - The beginning of Jesus' ministry in Galilee ...
 - Anticipates the great commission
 Mt 28, Mk 16, Lk 24, Jn 20

 - Anticipates the spread of the gospel in Acts 1.8
 Judea, Samaria, world Fulfills God's design ... the gospel is for all
