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- Our purpose to this point:
 - Understand what the gospel IS
 - Understand what the gospel DOES
- Another purpose to consider:
 - Who is the gospel for?
 - · God's intent for preaching the good news starts and ends at the same place...
 - The gospel is for all!



- · At, or near, the end of each "gospel" account we see "the great commission"
 - Mt 28.16ff Mk 16.14ff Lk 24.44ff Jn 20.24ff (3.16, 36, 12.42-50)
 - We usually refer to it as great because ...
 - It's divine/eternal in origin
 - It's grace/mercy/forgiveness/good news centered
 - It's all encompassing/universal in reach
 - "make disciples of all the nations" Mt.28-19
 - "all the world ... every creature" Mk 16.15 "to all nations" Lk 24.47
 - "the world"/"he who" Jn 3.16, 36, 12.44



- But what we read at, or near, the end of each "gospel" can also be found throughout the gospel records ... especially in Matthew a "Jewish" gospel
 - Mt refers to Gentiles more times (18)/more frequently (.98m) than other gospels
 - Mt 4.15
 Jesus' ministry starts/centers in Galilee of the Gentiles
 - Mt 10.18 The limited commission, though not directed to the **Gentiles**, was a testimony to them
 - Mt 12.18 Jesus would declare justice to the Gentiles



- Mt 12.21 Gentiles would trust in his name
- Mt 21.43
 The kingdom would be taken from the Jews & given to another nation
- Mt 24.12
 The gospel would be preached to all the nations
- Mt 25.32 All nations will be gathered before the Lord
- Mt 28.19
 We must make disciples of all the nations



- All souls are equal ...
 - Politics does not matter
 Color does not matter
 - Ethnicity does not matter
 Class does not matter
 - Education does not matter
 Wealth does not matter
 - Influence does not matter
 Numbers do not matter
 - Our past does not matter
 - Only Jesus matters ...
 - Only Jesus changes our future for better!
