





You told us, but we did not understand what you said.




· You told us, but we did not know that it applied to us.

 You told us, but we thought we could do whatever we wanted and still be right in your sight.




· You told us, but we found a better way.




You told us, but we followed another, higher, authority.




 You told us, but if you really loved us, you would let us do what we want without reprimand or punishment.
