


# The Principle Text

#### Jeremiah 31.31-33


"Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah— 32 not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, though I was a husband to them, says the LORD. 33 But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD:




# The Principle Text

#### Jeremiah 31.33-34


"I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. 34 No more shall every man teach his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, "Know the LORD," for they all shall know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them, says the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more."




- · Behold · Pay attention, something important is about to be said
- The days are coming It's not here yet, but it's on the horizon
- Says the LORD Jeremiah spoke/Baruch wrote, but the message was the LORD's
- I will make a new covenant the LORD will make it it will be a new agreement
- With the house of Israel and with the house of Judah Israel was already in captivity (722 BC) and Judah was about to go into captivity (606 BC) the new covenant applies to both parts of the nation




- Not according to the covenant
  This covenant will be different
- That I made with their fathers The first covenant was with the first generation of Israel after they left Egypt
- In the day that I took them ... lead them out First, God lead the nation out of Egypt Second, God made a covenant with Israel God delivered/revealed
- My covenant which they broke
  It was God's covenant, but Israel broke it
- Though I was a husband to them God was married to/owned/ruled over Israel




- This is the covenant Repeated emphasis: This new covenant will be different
- That I will make The future covenant would originate with God
- With the house of Israel Though the nation was divided for centuries, the new covenant would include both Judah (South) and Israel (North)
- After those days
  Repeated emphasis: The new covenant is future (Messianic)
- Timing: Israel in captivity Judah about to enter captivity "after" anticipates a time, at least, on the other side of their restoration/reunification (Messianic)



- How will the new covenant be different? Emphasis on the new covenant's (1) spiritual dimension (2) personal nature (3) faith/principles & morality/practice (4) God/man relationship
- I will put My law in their minds
  This covenant will be taught first, not inherited
- And write it on their hearts
  God inscribes our souls, not tablets of stone
- And I will be their God God pledges a new level/type of relationship
- And they shall be My people God forms a new type of people, one more inwardly than outwardly focused




- How will the new covenant be different?
- No more shall every man teach ...
- For they all shall know Me
- From the least to the greatest
- I will forgive their inquiry
- Their sin I will remember no more



- How will the new covenant be different? Emphasis ...
- On instruction over inheritance
- On internals over externals
  On hearts over stone
- On spiritual circumcision over physical circumcision
- On total soul engagement (intellect, ethics, emotion, volition, behavior) over behavior/action only
- On spiritual deliverance over physical




- How will the new covenant be different? Emphasis ...
- On difference in kind over difference in degree
- On will over work
- On individual over national On universal (all individuals) over particular (some)
- On access to God through Christ over human mediators
- On real/actual forgiveness over promised forgiveness
- On divine forgiveness over sinless perfection




#### Jeremiah 31.31-34 - New Covenant Fulfillment

- How will the new covenant be different? Emphasis ...
- On forgiveness and forgetting over reminders and symbolic rituals
- On eternal over temporal
  On life over death
- On reality over figures and symbols
- On grace over law
- On love over fear
- On Messiah over Moses




#### Jeremiah 31.31-34 - New Covenant Fulfillment

- Jesus' confirmed the new covenant with his blood: "Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you." Lk 22.20
- The Spirit gives life: "who also made us sufficient as ministers of the new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life." 2 Cor 3.6
- God and his people: "He who overcomes shall inherit all things, and I will be his God and he shall be My son." Rev 21.7




#### Jeremiah 31.31-34 - New Covenant Fulfillment

- "But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, inasmuch as He is also Mediator of a better covenant, which was established on better promises." Heb
  8.6ff "Because finding fault with them ... I will make a new covenant" Heb 8.8ff
- "To Him all the prophets witness that, through His name, whoever believes in Him will receive remission of sins." Acts 10.43
- "For this is My covenant with them, When I take away their sins." Rom 11.27
- "...Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." Heb 10.17



### Jeremiah 31.31-34 & 2 Timothy 3.14-15 - New Covenant Fulfillment

- "But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them, and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus."
